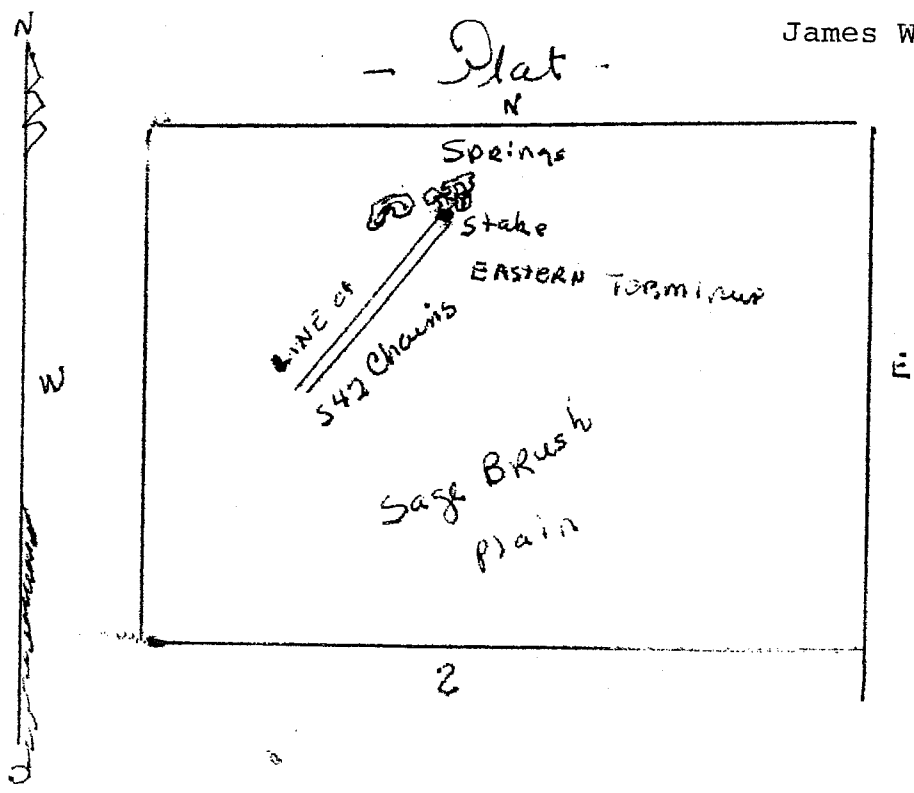

Know all men by these presents that I James Watts of Humboldt County in the State of Nevada desire to construct and maintain a water ditch or flume the same to be used for agriculture, milling, and mining purposes in accordance with an act of the Legislature of the State of Nevada entitled an act to allow a person or persons to divert the water of any spring, river or stream and to provide for the rights of way through the land of others approved March 5, 1866 and Act amending thereof approved March 3rd 1869. I therefore certify that the name of said ditch or flumes shall be the Watt Irrigating Milling & Mining Ditch and Flume, and I claim the Hot Spring formally known as Williams(?) Hot Springs situated in the County & State aforesaid and about one mile and one half westerly from the Jersey Mine and the eastern terminus of said ditch shall be at a stake which the waters of said springs are diverted and marked "Watts irrigating ditch eastern terminus and running thence in a general south west course for the distance of 42 (forty two) chains to a stake marked Watts irrigating ditch western terminus and the accompanying plat is hereby made apart thereof as showing the general course and termini of said ditch and flume and further that during the year 1878 I used the waters of said springs to raise a crop and that it is my intention to buy the same as soon as the United States surveys are run as to include said Hot Springs. In witness whereof I have hereto set my hand and seal this 6th day of January AD 1879.

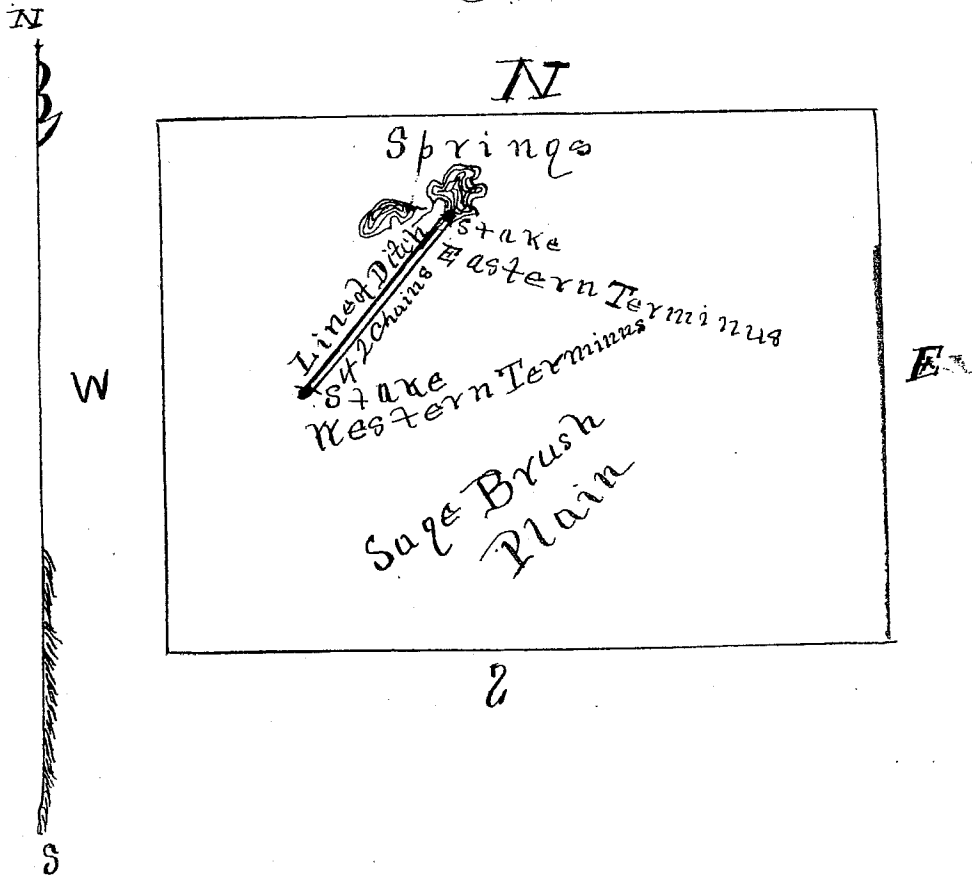
